ANNOUNCEMENT

GENERAL INFORMATION The **5th EduSport Trophy** will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2022, the Special Regulations and Technical Rules for Singles & Pair Skating and in accordance with all pertinent ISU Communications.

Participation in the **5th EduSport Trophy** is open to all Competitors who belong to an ISU Member, and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3 a) and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 2030 or any update of this Communication.

In accordance with Rule 109 of the ISU General Regulations and ISU Communication 2030 all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate.

The local organizing committee has the right and obligation to check the personal identification documents of the athletes to determine whether they are allowed to compete, whether they are competing in the right category, etc. Without the documents, the athlete will be excluded from the competition.

PLACE OF THE COMPETITION: Allianz-Tiriac Arena -Drumul Gării Odăi, Bucharest -Otopeni 075100 (near Henri Coanda International Airport). The rink is indoor, heated. The size of the rink is 60 m x 30 m.



ENTRIES

All clubs, which are members of National Figure Skating Federations, are invited to take part at the competition. Each club can enter any number of Skaters into every category. Organizers have the right to refuse or limit the participation in competition. Depending on the number of participants the organizer will decide whether or not to accept extra entries.

In case of a large number of entries the Organizer reserves the right to split the groups according to age.

DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES

The entry forms and the "Program Content Sheet" for **all categories** must be sent to the Organizing Committee until December 20th, 2022 by email at: edusporttrophy@gmail.com.

It is mandatory that the Program Content Sheet will be filled precisely for each Skater in English using terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication. It is not permitted to hand over the Program Content Sheets directly to the acting Officials.

Official entries of Team Leaders, Team Officials, Coaches/Choreographers, Team Medical staff etc. must be made together with the entries for Competitors and Judges.

CANCELLATION

Cancellation of the competitor entry, if any, has to be done till December 27th, on e-mail edusporttrophy@gmail.com.

GDPR

By entering, all participants accept that personal data are collected by the Organizing Committee (OC) and such data are stored and used by the OC, and when necessary, third parties, for the purposes only of, and to the extent necessary only in relation to facilitate their participation in the competition; personal data may include but will not be limited to full legal name as per national identity documents, address, date of birth, nationality, sex, etc.

MUSIC

In accordance with Rule 343 in the ISU Special Regulations Technical Rules Single Pair Skating, the following method to submit the Competitor's music to the Organizing Committee must be followed:

- the participating member is responsible for submitting their Competitor's music as direct attachment to an email to the Organizing Committee (edusporttrophy@gmail.com) until December 20th, 2022

Please note: some music files might exceed the size of a regular email. In this case, an email-based transfer service which allows to send large files could be used to send the file to the OC.

- each submission shall be labelled with the name of the ISU Member, name of the category, segment, the name(s) of the competitor(s) and the exact running time of the music (not skating time).

Example: ROU_Senior_Men_SP_POPESCU-Andrei-Radu-2min40sec
ROU_Senior_Men_FS_POPESCU-Andrei-Radu-4min05sec

- the music files must be sent only as MP3 file formats. Any other format is not acceptable.

Please note: Files in MP3 format may have a significant difference in the music quality when reproduced. The Organizing Committee in this case is not responsible if the music quality would be insufficient.

- Each Competitor must have an own back-up drive (USB Stick) for each program in MP3 format .
- The exact running time of the music (not skating time) must be communicated to the Organizing Committee when submitting the music and shall be certified by the Competitor/Coach/Team Leader at the time of registration.
- During the 1st Official Practice, the music will be played as indicated in the Practice Schedule and will allow to verify the correctness of the submitted music. If there is an issue with the music, the Team Leader/Coach may be allowed to change the music by presenting an acceptable reproduction to the Organizing Committee's Music Team (USB Stick with file format MP3 file).

ENTRY FEE

- ❖ 70 EURO/350 RON skater for Chicks, Cubs, Novice Basic, Novice Intermediate, Recreational & Adult categories – for payments made by bank transfer or cash at the Organizing Committee, until December 20th, 2022.
- ❖ 80 EURO/400 RON skater for Chicks, Cubs, Novice Basic, Novice Intermediate, Recreational & Adult categories – for Late Entry Fee/Late Payment - made by bank transfer or cash at the Organizing Committee, after December 20th, 2022.

We kindly ask the federations/clubs to make **one payment** for all its participants.

If a skater has been entered in the competition, but cannot participate, she/he can be replaced by another skater, from the same category, until **December 27th, 2022**.

The entry fee will not be refunded in case of withdrawals for any reason.

All bank charges have to be taken by the payer.

JUDGES

Each ISU Member participating on the competition may enter one International or ISU Judge. The official entry form for Judges must reach the Organizing Committee, not later than December 20th, 2022. The Panels will be drawn immediately after the closing of entries. The members concerned will be notified of the result of the draw.

Each panel of Judges will consist of at least 3 Judges (Referee included).

The Organizer covers the accommodation expenses with full board only for the confirmed Referees, invited Judges, Technical Controllers and Technical Specialists, Data and Replay Operators, beginning with dinner on January 11 until dinner on January 15, 2023.

Travel expenses (based on economy fare) will be covered only for Referees, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialist, Data and Replay Operators and for invited judges.

Expenses for accommodation and meals for Competitors and other Team officials will not be covered by the organizer.

INSURANCE / LIABILITY

In accordance with Rule 119, it is the sole responsibility of each Member participating in the **5th EduSport Trophy**, to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means.

It is an internal matter of each ISU Member to decide the issue who shall pay the premium for such insurance. The Organizer assumes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage in connection incurred by Competitors and Officials.

The Organizing Committee will provide medical emergency aid during competition.

ACCREDITATION

- ❖ The accreditation will start on January 11, 2023 at the Allianz-Tiriac Arena Rink.
- ❖ In accordance with the ISU Directive please note that at the time of registration we have to copy and file the passport / clearance certificate of the Skaters.
- ❖ Citizen / Residence requirements and Clearance Procedure:

- In accordance with Rule 109 of ISU Regulations and ISU Communication 2030 or any update of it, all skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate.
- ❖ The local organizing committee has the right and obligation to check the personal identification documents of the athletes to determine whether they are allowed to compete, whether they are competing in the right category, etc. Without the documents, the athlete will be excluded from the competition.

DRAW

- ❖ The opening draw for the order of skating for Chicks, Cubs, Novice Basic, Novice Intermediate, Recreational & Adult categories will be held on January 11, 2023 and the starting order will be available on www.edusporttrophy.org
- ❖ The exact place and time will be published in the official detailed schedule. Due to Covid-19 pandemic it is possible to do the draw without competitors present and only have a minimum number of persons present with the Referee and the Technical controller.

AWARDING

The winners of every category will receive medals and diplomas. All competitors will receive diplomas.

ACCOMMODATION

- ❖ All participants, except Technical panel members and invited Judges, must cover their accommodation expenses by themselves.
- ❖ In order to book the accommodation at special event prices, the reservation must be booked and paid by each member or club only through Organizing Committee. Reservations for skaters who wish to stay at the Vienna House hotel, will be made upon request, depending on availability, in writing to the address edusporttrophy@gmail.com.
- ❖ The payment for accommodation shall be made by bank transfer until December 20, 2022. The Organizer can guarantee and provide you accommodation only after receiving 100% of total payment for accommodation until December 20, 2022. In case of cancellation, we will return the payment for accommodation after we will apply a cancellation fee equal to the price for 1 night/ room.

PLEASE NOTE:

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to cancel/postponed the "5th EduSport Trophy", if due to the Coronavirus (Covid-19) or any other situation, the decision or recommendation of the national/local government or any other institution will not permit to conduct an event or if travel restrictions to/from Romania will block the teams for entry or departure, without compensation.

Pandemic rules: we will follow the instructions and recommendations from the "Guidelines for ISU events during the Covid-19 pandemic".

At the moment of publication there are no restrictions enforced by Romanian authorities.

Skaters are advised to seek advice from their relevant government agencies, travel and medical providers regarding travel to any country and any affective restrictions in place. The restrictions can change at a short notice.

Cancellation of the competition is also possible due to insufficient number of registered ISU members or competitors.

Notice of cancellation or program changes will be published at least 7 days before the start of the competition. We advise all delegation to take into consideration for any travel arrangements.
