The 6th EduSport Trophy will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2022, the Special Regulations and Technical Rules for Singles \& Pair Skating and in accordance with all relevant ISU Communications.

Participation in the 6th EduSport Trophy is open to all Competitors who belong to an ISU Member, and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3 and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 2526 or any update of this Communication.

In accordance with Rule 109 of the ISU General Regulations and ISU Communication 2526 all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate.

The local organizing committee has the right and obligation to check the personal identification documents of the athletes to determine whether they are allowed to compete, whether they are competing in the right category, etc. Without the documents, the athlete will be excluded from the competition.

Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be sent when registering in the competition, for verification.

## GDPR

By entering, all participants accept that personal data are collected by the Organizing Committee (OC) and such data are stored and used by the OC, and when necessary, third parties, for the purposes only of, and to the extent necessary only in relation to facilitate their participation in the competition; personal data may include but will not be limited to full legal name as per national identity documents, address, date of birth, nationality, sex, etc.

## PLACE

Allianz-Tiriac Arena -Drumul Gării Odăi, Bucharest -Otopeni 075100 (near Henri Coanda International Airport). The rink is indoor, heated. The size of the rink is $60 \mathrm{~m} \times 30 \mathrm{~m}$.


ENTRIES: Athlete registrations will begin on October 25, 2023, on www.EduSportTrophy.org
All clubs, which are members of National Figure Skating Federations, are invited to take part at the competition. Each club can enter any number of Skaters into every category. Organizers have the right to refuse or limit the participation in competition. Depending on the number of participants the organizer will decide whether or not to accept extra entries.

Official entries of Team Leaders, Team Officials, Coaches/Choreographers, Team Medical staff etc. must be made together with the entries for Competitors and Judges.

The entries for the competition will be held via www.EduSportTrophy.org. Before entry procedure the federation/ club representative needs to apply for a new account on www.EduSportTrophy.org.

## DEADLINE

All the entries of skaters and officials, Program Content Sheet, music, passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be uploaded on www.edusporttrophy.org, when registering the skaters in the competition, until November 15th, 2023.

All entries sent after November 15, 2023 are considered as late entries.
Cancellation of the competitor entry, if any, has to be done until November 22nd, 2023. For any latter cancellation the team leader of respective Federation or Club will be asked to pay the entry fee.

It is mandatory that the Program Content Sheet will be filled precisely for each Skater in English using terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication. It is not permitted to hand over the Program Content Sheets directly to the acting Officials.

## MUSIC

In accordance with Rule 343 in the ISU Special Regulations Technical Rules Single Pair Skating, the ISU Member/Club is responsible for submitting their Competitor's music as upload on the federation/club account from www.EduSportTrophy.org, until November 15th, 2023.

Each submission must be labelled with the name of the ISU Member, name of the category, segment, the name(s) of the competitor and the exact running time of the music (not skating time).
Example:

- ROU_Senior_Men_FS_POPESCU-Andrei-Radu-4min05sec

The music files must be sent only as MP3 file formats. Any other format is not acceptable.
Please note: Files in MP3 format may have a significant difference in the music quality when reproduced. The Organizing Committee in this case is not responsible if the music quality would be insufficient. Each Competitor must have its own back-up drive (USB Stick) for each program in MP3 format. The exact running time of the music (not skating time) must be communicated to the Organizing Committee when submitting the music and shall be certified at the time of registration.

In case the music files have not been submitted in time to the Organizing Committee, the skater(s) must present their music latest at the time of registration on the above defined mean and in the defined format.

## INSURANCE / LIABILITY

The Organizing Committee will provide medical emergency aid during competition.

## ACCREDITATION

The accreditation will start on December 6th, 2023 at the Allianz-Tiriac Arena Rink.
In accordance with Rule 109 of the ISU General Regulations and ISU Communication 2526 all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate.

The local organizing committee has the right and obligation to check the personal identification documents of the athletes to determine whether they are allowed to compete, whether they are competing in the right category, etc. Without the documents, the athlete will be excluded from the competition.

Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be sent when registering in the competition (until November 15, 2023), for verification.

## DRAW

The opening draw for the order of skating for Novice Advanced, Novice Intermediate, Novice Basic, Cubs, Chicks, Adults and Recreational Categories will be held electronically on November 5th, 2023, and will be available on the competition website.

Starting order for the Free Skating of Advanced Novice category will be in reverse order of the results in the Short Program.

## AWARDING

The winners of every category will receive medals and diplomas. All competitors will receive diplomas. The exact time of the Awarding Ceremonies will be announced in the detailed schedule in due time.

Please make sure that all skaters are represented at the Ceremony!

## JUDGES

Each ISU Member participating in the competition may enter one International or ISU Judge. All the entries of Judges must be uploaded on www.edusporttrophy.org until November 15th, 2023.

- The Panels will be drawn after the closing of entries. The members concerned will be notified of the result of the draw.
- The Panel of Judges for Novice, Junior and Senior will be composed as determined by the relevant ISU Communications.
- The Organizer covers the accommodation expenses with full board only for the confirmed Referees, invited Judges, Technical Controllers and Technical Specialists, Data and Replay Operators, beginning with dinner on December 5th until lunch on December 11, 2023.

Travel expenses (based on economy fare) will be covered only for Referees, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialist, Data and Replay Operators and for invited judges.

Expenses for transport, accommodation and meals for Competitors, Coaches and other Team officials will not be covered by the organizer.

- Free Skating: 2 min, $+/-10 \mathrm{sec}$
- A well balanced Free Skating program for Chicks and cubs must contain: a. Maximum of four (4) jump elements one of which must be an Axel type jump. There may be up to two (2) jump combinations or one (1) jump combination and one (1) jump sequence. Jump combinations and the jump sequence consist of two (2) jumps. In the jump sequence the second jump must be an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump into the take-off curve of the Axel jump. One full revolution on the ice between the jumps (free foot can touch the ice, but without weight transfer) keeps the element in the frame of the definition of a jump sequence. Jumps executed in a jump sequence receive their full value. No triple and quadruple jumps are allowed. Only one single jump and one double jump (including Double Axel) can be repeated once.
b. There must be a maximum of two (2) spins of a different nature (abbreviation), one of which must be a spin combination and one must be a spin with no change of position. The spin combination with a change of foot and a minimum of eight (8) revolutions or without a change of foot with a minimum of six (6) revolutions. The spin in one position with a change of foot minimum of eight (8) revolutions or spin in one position without change of foot minimum of six (6) evolutions. In both spins flying entries are allowed.
c. There must be a maximum of one (1) step sequence fully utilizing the ice surface.
Levels explanations:

For Chicks and cubs, in all elements that are subject to Levels, only features up to Level 2 will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

The following Program Components are judged:

- Composition
- Presentation
- Skating Skills

The factor for the Program Components is 1.67

Participation in the Free Skating at the Adult Figure Skating Categories is open only to competitors who have reached at least the age of twenty-eight (28) before 1st July 2023.

- A skater competing after 1st July 2023 in an ISU Championship, International Competition or National Championship of a Member Federation (other than an Adult International Competition or Adult National Championships) or a competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National Championship of a Member Federation (other than an Adult National Championship) MAY NOT participate in this competition.
- A skater competing prior to 1st July 2023 in an ISU Championship or National Championship of a Member Federation or a competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National championship of a Member Federation MAY participate in this competition.
- A skater meeting the age requirements of this competition, who competes in adult-only events (Single Free Skating) at a National Championships or competition from which a competitor qualifies for the National Championships of a Member Federation MAY compete in this competition.
- All other members of an ISU Member Federation who meet the age requirements may participate.


## PROGRAM SCHEDULE

The timetable, results and other information will be announced on the official site of the competition www.edusporttrophy.org and on the information board in the ice rink.

- Please, be informed that changes in the event schedule may occur due to the final number of entries and some categories can be moved to another day for proper organization.
- Also, only the daily starting times are fixed. Following the morning start the time schedule of the event is flexible, which means that in case of cancellations certain categories may start some time earlier than in the Preliminary/Final Schedule.
